Green light for Bradbourne Lakes overhaul

We have secured £1.6 million from the National Lottery to help fund major improvements at Bradbourne Lakes.

The funding, together with £502,000 secured by us from house builders, will fund the 'Bradbourne Re-bourne' project, the biggest overhaul of the Lakes since they were built 300 years ago.

The five ornamental lakes date back to 1740 and formed part of the Bradbourne Estate. Water from the lakes feeds the River Darent, one of a handful of ecologically important chalk streams in the country.

Over the years we, along with the community, have maintained the much-loved park, including investing in new fencing, gates and benches. But, it is now in need of major investment to restore the interconnected lakes, paths and facilities making it fit for the 21st century.

The project will start in 2025 when the Lakes will be drained and restored using reclaimed and locally sourced materials. Sluices and leaks will also be fixed.

Green spaces will be planted with wildflowers. Silt will be removed and reused to form new reedbeds and areas for vegetation, improving biodiversity. This work will improve water quality, supporting wildlife downstream in the River Darent. The Kent Wildlife Trust, South East Rivers Trust, Mind and Historic England will run activities to promote conservation, protect the heritage and improve residents' mental health.

Cllr Irene Roy, our Cabinet Member for Cleaner and Greener, says: "Bradbourne Lakes are a jewel in the heart of the community, so I am very excited about this project. The National Lottery grant means we can really push on with our ambitious £2.1 million Bradbourne Re-bourne plans.

"We have been aware for some time that the Lakes could be so much better. A build-up of silt has impacted wildlife and water quality and limits some activities, such as model boating. Paths are uneven making the site difficult for some.

"The project will make this site more accessible to everyone. Other changes will support nature, including new trees and hedges, helping to do our bit to tackle climate change.

"I look forward to working with our partners to deliver exciting activities, promoting the Lake's rich history and running sessions that encourage people of all ages and backgrounds to support nature and the historic environment."

"We want to say a big 'thank you' to the Bradbourne Lakes Residents' Association who have given up much of their time to contribute to our plans. We look forward to working with them to deliver this exciting project."

Cllr Roddy Hogarth was elected as Sevenoaks District Council's new Leader at the Annual Council meeting on Tuesday 14 May 2024.

Cllr Hogarth, who represents Seal and Weald, was first elected to the Council in May 2011. He brings a wealth of leadership experience having previously been the Council's Cabinet Member for Economic and Community Development for three years then the Commissioner for the Public Realm for a further four years.

Cllr Thornton is an immense talent who will continue to be a key part of my new Cabinet Team.

"Cllr Perry Cole remains our Deputy Leader and our Cabinet Member for Housing and Health, Cllr Kevin Maskell the Cabinet Member for Finance and Cllr Lesley Dyball for People and Places.

"Joining the new Cabinet are Cllr Michael Horwood, who takes on the Improvement and Innovation role, and Cllr Irene Roy, our Cabinet Member for Cleaner and Greener."

Local plan update

Later this year, you'll have a chance to comment on the final version of 'Plan 2040', our new local plan.

The local plan sets out in broad terms what can be built and where between 2025 and 2040.

An updated, final version of the plan, taking into account the community's comments from our consultations last winter, will be published later this year for comments.

This version of the local plan will include the sites earmarked for new developments, including new housing. It also includes planning policies to promote resident's health and wellbeing and the protection of the environment and the overwhelming majority of the Green Belt.

The exact dates of our final consultation, and our 'Popup' sessions where our planning team will be on hand to answer your questions, will be published nearer the time.

After the consultation has closed, the comments will be

collated and shared with the Government appointed Planning Inspector, who will carry out an independent examination of the local plan.

The examination will take place in public next year and will consider the community's comments and if the plan was produced in accordance with the legislation.



Explore our beautiful countryside by rail!

The Darent Valley Community Rail Partnership has launched a new app to showcase the amazing walking trails you can take from the train stations along the route.



The trails can be downloaded and used offline and they offer a whole range of options, from short circular walks to long panoramic trails along the hills surrounding the valley. They include beautiful views, historical places of interest and places to stop along the way.

The routes have been put together by the Darent Valley Landscape

Partnership Scheme, the Darent Valley Community Rail Partnership, which includes Sevenoaks District Council and walking enthusiasts who live in the area.

Our Cabinet Member for People and Places, Cllr Lesley Dyball, says: "The Rail Trails are a wonderful opportunity to get outside and explore the local area whilst leaving the car at home.

"Each of the walks starts and ends at one of the stations on the Darent Valley rail line which is served by Southeastern and Thameslink trains.

"Along the route you'll find a medieval deer park, a chalk stream, a Victorian viaduct, Roman villas and riverside villages. There's usually a good pub or tearoom within close proximity too!"

The trails can be downloaded on the App Store or Google Play by searching 'Darent Valley Trails'. Paper copies can be found at some of the railway stations along the line.

New affordable homes fund Edenbridge Stangrove Estate improvements

The new sale of 13 Councilconstructed homes are funding community improvements on the Stangrove Estate in Edenbridge.

The new high-quality properties, each with their own parking spaces, meet high environmental standards and come with energy-efficient air source heat pumps, helping to reduce carbon emissions.

Five of the homes were sold on the open market and the remaining eight were sold to Quercus Housing, our affordable housing company, and are already providing affordable housing for people with a local housing need.

Funding generated by the sale of the homes is paying for the first major improvements on the Stangrove Estate since it was built in the 1950s and 1960s. These include 72 off-road communal parking spaces, some with electric vehicle charging points, a new, larger community shop and landscaping.


Cllr Michael Horwood, our Cabinet Member for Improvement & Innovation, says: "This project has provided 13 much-needed new dwellings with the majority providing new affordable homes. The combined

project is also funding a raft of improvements that local residents have told us are much needed, such as additional parking and improvement to the estate's open spaces.

"This development is another part of the Council's plan to deliver more affordable homes for Sevenoaks District residents, as well as using the proceeds to improve the local area.

"While the works have brought much-needed improvements to the Stangrove Estate, any project of this size will inevitably cause some disruption, so I want to thank local people for their patience and understanding during construction."

Twenty-eight year old Joel Kentish has been helping to keep his community clean for more than a year. After he volunteered for last year's Great British Spring Clean in March 2023, Joel has been litter picking almost daily in his home village of South Darenth.

Joel collects several bags of rubbish each week, which are collected every Monday by our refuse crews.

Joel's Mum, Lindsey, says: "Joel always wanted to be a waste collector since the age of three. He even had a toy refuse freighter as a very young child. But he has a condition that prevents this from happening.



"However, his passion for waste collection has never left him. He really enjoys keeping his community tidy and pleasant for all who live and visit here.

"The highlight of his week is when the Council picks up the waste he's diligently collected. He's sparked up a great friendship with the crews who always stop for a chat."

It has been a year of success for Everyone Active as it marks its first anniversary of managing Edenbridge and Sevenoaks Leisure Centres and Lullingstone Park Golf Course.



Since taking the helm in April 2023, an increasing number of residents are actively pursuing fitness through gym memberships.

Edenbridge Leisure Centre has experienced a remarkable 60 per cent increase in gym memberships over the past year, attracting a diverse range of individuals keen on maintaining an active lifestyle. Meanwhile, Sevenoaks Leisure Centre has seen a 21 per cent increase in gym members during the same period.

Alongside swimming lessons, Sevenoaks Leisure Centre has continued to be home to Sevenoaks Swimming Club, which has over 300 members.

Residents have their say on Sevenoaks town proposals

Hundreds of people had a say on our early ideas to regenerate the land around Buckhurst Lane close to Sevenoaks High Street.

Sevenoaks District Council and Kent County Council own property in this area. Together, we have come up with broad regeneration ideas to make the town a more exciting place to live, work and spend time.

Our ideas include a new energy efficient leisure centre, a combined library, art gallery, museum and adult education centre, improved pedestrian links to Knole Park and a new market hall and a hotel. The proposal includes new homes, which would help to pay towards the project.

More than 500 people attended our in-person and online events and nearly 400 people took part in our survey during April and May.

We're now drawing up a revised brief, taking into account residents' views, which will be considered by our Councillors in July 2024.

Sevenoaks town walking, wheeling and riding route gets moving

After listening to our communities' views on a two mile sustainable travel route linking East to West Sevenoaks, we are making some changes to our proposals.

The Sevenoaks Town East to West route will provide walkers, wheelers (people on scooters, parents with prams and wheelchair users) and riders with safe routes in the town.

Our proposals would link Trinity, Weald of Kent and Tunbridge Wells Boys Grammar schools in the east with Amherst and Riverhead schools in the west. The route passes via Knole Academy, Sevenoaks Primary and Walthamstow Junior schools and close to the rail station and other facilities.

Last summer, 490 people took part in a survey to share their views on our initial plans. The majority, 61%, were supportive with 25% not supporting the proposal and the remaining 14% not sure.

Residents also raised issues and concerns about some parts of the route and the loss of parking spaces.

In response, we are proposing to take the route through Cavendish Avenue, Oakdene Road and Bradbourne Vale Road instead of Clockhouse Lane, Bradbourne Park Road and James's Road.

Seven on-street car parking spaces at the junction of Bradbourne Road and Bradbourne Vale Road will be relocated to Bradbourne Vale Road along with an additional six new parking spaces.

The route will be delivered in partnership with Kent County Council with a £1.2 million Government grant. Work is expected to begin in the autumn.

£600k to help White Oak go greener

We recently secured £612,950 to fund new solar panels at White Oak Leisure Centre in Swanley, helping to cut the centre's carbon footprint.

White Oak opened in early 2022 and is one of the most environmentally-friendly, energy efficient centres around. The solar panels will further reduce energy use and running costs. Work on the installation should start later this year.

Cllr Lesley Dyball, our Cabinet Member for People and Places, says:

"We are thrilled to have successfully bid for funding to help White Oak Leisure Centre go even greener.

"Swimming is great for residents' health and wellbeing, as well as teaching children to stay safe around water. But running a swimming pool can be expensive due to high energy costs. Not only will the solar panels reduce the centre's running costs for years to come, they will cut its carbon emissions, helping us to tackle the challenges of climate change."

The funding came from Phase 2 of the Government's Swimming Pool Support Fund.

Alfresco dining in the District

As the weather warms and our thoughts turn to exploring the outdoors, it's always a bonus to have a wonderful pub garden or café to head to.

We've been out and about to produce a tasty menu of local venues, some off the beaten track and others in the heart of our town.

With all the green hills in the District, it's no surprise we have plenty of pubs with spectacular views. Among the best are:


• The Chafford Arms in Fordcombe. a pretty Arts & Crafts style building with a generous garden with extensive views to Tonbridge and beyond

- The Spotted Dog in Penshurst, perched on hills south of the village with terraces with picnic tables
- The Bottle House Inn, also in Penshurst, a lovely location overlooking the surrounding countryside
- The Bull in Horton Kirby has views across the lower Darent Valley

For pubs with great children's play areas try:

- The Pheasant Plucker, between Sevenoaks and Ide Hill, a rambling venue with all sorts of options inside and out, including cabins and play areas
- The Bullfinch in Riverhead has fairy lights strung out over the garden and plenty of cosy cabins to choose from







- The Little Brown Jug by Penshurst train station has a large garden, a play area and plenty of pavilions to enjoy (and the occasional beer festival too)
- The Royal Oak near New Ash Green is a gastropub with a garden and a children's play area

If being close to a river is appealing, or you have been out on a long walk with the dogs, try:

- The Lion, Farningham. This
 pub and restaurant has been
 welcoming day-trippers for
 hundreds of years. It was even
 a favourite location for Charles
 Dickens when fishing for trout in
 the River Darent, which flows by
 the pub garden
- The Plough in Eynsford faces the River Darent and has plenty of outdoor tables.

For rural beer gardens in serene locations, try:

- The Wheatsheaf in Bough Beech, a historic pub with cosy medieval interiors but state-of-the-art tepees in the beer garden, among plenty of blossoming flowers
- The Leicester Arms in Penshurst has a series of terraces descending from the stunning pub and occasional outdoor music events
- The Greyhound, Charcott has a peaceful garden and plenty of delicious food options, including pizza nights

If you're more inclined to wander around one of our lively towns, then a café with a courtyard or a terrace in the sun might be more your taste:

- Brunch in Westerham, tucked away in a secluded courtyard seconds from the High Street, offers not only the chance to check out a small deli shop but also have tasty treats outdoors
- The George and Dragon in Westerham has a large terrace overlooking the North Downs
- Café on the Vine in Sevenoaks, Sopranos, Nonna Cappuccino,



Gail's and Malabar in the centre of town all have outside seating areas to watch the world go by

- Hidden Jen in Sevenoaks has a pretty courtyard dining area for warm nights, with the occasional music event too
- The Cotton Mill Micropub in Swanley has outdoor tables. With so many cask ales and real ciders to test, it's a spot to head to for warm summer evenings
- Ye Olde Crown in Edenbridge goes from strength to strength, with music, quizzes, special chef nights, home-baked cakes and a large courtyard with plenty of tables

The District is blessed with plenty of tea rooms and cafés with attractive outdoor areas, like the Fir Tree House Tea Rooms in Penshurst, the Tulip Tea Room in Chiddingstone or the Porcupine Pantry Café just outside the entrance to Penshurst Place. For the cyclists among you, don't forget to check out the new extension at the Velo Barn above Westerham – and get your bike serviced at the same time!

Many of our garden centres offer upmarket fare, with a favourite being Arthur's at Coolings Garden Centre in Knockholt or the elegant Twig and Spoon Café at Woodlands Garden Centre in West Kingsdown. And that's before we get to all the National Trust properties with standout cafés, perhaps one of the best being at The Brewhouse Café in Knole, with views across the deer park from the rooftop terrace.

Finally, we're so fortunate to have two award-wining vineyards - Squerryes near Westerham and The Mount Vineyard in Shoreham. Each have extensive outdoor seating areas with sunset views, and with The Mount a five-minute walk from Shoreham station, it couldn't be easier to get to.

So what are you waiting for? Get on your bike, put on your trainers, don the hiking boots, hop on the train or ease yourself into a car and explore all these wonderful outdoor spaces!

Edenbridge health centre officially opens

Local residents. patients, Sevenoaks **District Councillors** and other dignitaries attended the official opening of the new, £14 million Edenbridge Memorial Health Centre in April 2024.

After more than seven years of planning, engagement and construction, the centre, which combines a GP surgery, children's services, diagnostic services, a wellbeing centre and a wide range of outpatient clinics, welcomed its first patients last November.

Kent Community Health NHS Foundation Trust (KCHFT) and Edenbridge Medial Practice run the majority of services, along with other partners, including our One You team.

Alongside specialist clinical care, there is also a wellbeing day centre



on-site to support people living with dementia or social isolation.

We played an important role in bringing the centre to the District by contributing £1.2 million of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL), funding we secured from developers.

Cllr Julia Thornton, our Cabinet Member for Development and Conservation, says: "I am especially proud that the Council has been able to support this centre. From the very early days, our planners worked closely with the NHS to get the project off the ground, through

to making a substantial contribution toward the build.

"Not only does it bring many health services together under one roof, the new centre is one of the most environmentally friendly and energy efficient buildings there is, helping us all to do our bit to tackle climate change.

"I'm certain this major investment by the Kent Community Health NHS Foundation Trust and others will improve the quality of life for so many of our residents for generations to come."





Putting the brakes on car meets and racing

Earlier this year, the Community Safety Partnership placed a Public Space Protection Order in Badgers Mount and Halstead to tackle anti-social behavior associated with car meets. racing and general motor nuisance.

In partnership with Kent Police, the Metropolitan Police and Bromley Council, we consulted with residents after a number of complaints affecting the London Road, part of the Orpington By-Pass and the M25 Junction 4 spur road.

A Public Space Protection Order gives the Police and councils the power to issue on-the-spot warnings, or a fixed penalty notice for antisocial behaviour.

It also prohibits behaviour that may cause harassment, alarm, and distress. This means those causing trouble cannot return to the area within 24 hours.

The Public Space Protection Order began on 1 May 2024 and can last for up to three years.

Big drop in anti-social behaviour

The Community Safety Partnership is delighted to report a 14% reduction in anti-social behaviour over the last year.

The figures, up to the end of March 2024, show a reduction of 140 reports across the District.

Over the last year, the Partnership has carried out many initiatives to help residents report and reduce anti-social behaviour and has gone into schools, attended community events, visited youth clubs and more.

Protect your business from shoplifters

The Community Safety Partnership is going all out to protect businesses from crimes, including shoplifting.

Although we have seen a small decrease in shoplifting over the last year, the Partnership has been working hard with local businesses to reduce it further.

Kent Police has lots of advice on its website about how to secure your shop from shoplifters and how to spot a shoplifter.

There is a monthly Business Group, run by Kent Police and chaired by Chief Inspector Elizabeth Jones, where traders can discuss their concerns.

Local Shops can also get involved in the Sevenoaks Safer Towns Partnership, which works with shops, Police and our CCTV Control Room to prevent and deter shoplifting and other business crime. For more information on this scheme, email community. safety@sevenoaks.gov.uk.
