Fawkham Neighbourhood Plan Information Statement

A Referendum relating to the adoption of the Fawkham Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 13 February 2025.

This statement provides information on the Referendum that is taking place, and the neighbourhood plan it relates to.

Referendum on the Fawkham Neighbourhood Plan

A Referendum asks you to vote 'yes' or 'no' to a question.

The guestion which will be asked in the Referendum is:

Do you want Sevenoaks District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Fawkham to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?

The neighbourhood area for Fawkham is identified on the map which is included with this information statement.

The Referendum area is identical to the area which has been designated as the Fawkham Neighbourhood Area.

Entitlement to vote

A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if, on Tuesday 28 January 2025;

- he or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the referendum area;
 and
- his or her qualifying address for the election is in the referendum area. A person's
 qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors,
 the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be registered.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
